# Stomach Pain wei tong

- Stomach pain manifests frequent painful sensations in the epigastrium as its major symptom
- Includes:
  - Acute and chronic gastritis, gastric and duodenal ulcers, gastric cancer and gastric neurosis

# Etiology and pathogenesis

- Repletion and vacuity
  - Repletion: cold evil, food stagnation, qi stagnation, accumulation of heat and blood stasis
  - Vacuity: vacuity of stomach yin, vacuity-cold of the spleen and stomach
- Related to liver and spleen
- Initially involves qi, and then blood

## **Patterns**

- Stomach cold
- Food stagnation
- Disruption of the stomach by liver qi
- Accumulation heat in the liver and stomach
- Obstruction of the stomach by static blood
- Depletion of stomach yin
- Vacuity cold of the spleen and stomach

## Stomach cold

- Abrupt onset of epigastric pain which is aggravated by cold and alleviated by warmth, no thirst, white coating and tight, wiry pulse.
- Treatment method: dissipate cold, relieve pain
- Formula: liang fu wan
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, ST36 zu san li, PC6 nei guan, SP4 gong sun

- Liang fu wan:
  - Gao liang jiang, xiang fu zi
- Modifications:
  - Cold evil is predominant, add wu zhu yu, chen pi
  - For stomach pain caused by wind-cold, use xiang su san, xiang fu zi, zi su ye, chen pi, zhi gan cao
  - For cold resulting in food stagnation: add zhi shi, shen qu, ji nei jin, ban xia, sheng jiang

# Obstruction by food stagnation

- Stomach pain aggravated by pressure, and relieved by vomiting or expelling flatus. eructation of foul gas, acid regurgitation, epigastric distention. Thick slimy coating, slippery pulse.
- Treatment method: disperse food, abduct stagnation, relieve pain
- Formula: bao he wan
- Acupuncture: Ren11 jian li, ST36 zu san li, PC6 nei guan, M-LE-1 li nei ting

#### Bao he wan:

 Shan zha, shen qu, jiang ban xia, fu ling, chen pi, lian qiao, lai fu zi

#### Modifications:

- For distention of epigastrium and abdomen, add zhi shi, sha ren, bing lang
- For constipation, use xiao cheng qi tang: da huang, zhi shi, hou po

# Disruption of the stomach by liver qi

- Epigastric distention and pain spreading through the costal regions, belching, acid regurgitation, which are associated with stress. White coating, wiry pulse.
- Treatment method: soothe the liver, rectify qi, harmonize the stomach, relieve pain
- Formula: chai hu shu gan san
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, LV14 qi men, ST36 zu san li, PC6 nei guan, LV3 tai chong, GB34 yang ling quan

- Chan hu shu gan san:
  - Chai hu, bai shao yao, xiang fu zi,
    chuan xiong, chen pi, zhi ke, gan cao
- Modifications:
  - For severe pain, add chuan lian zi, yan hu suo
  - For frequent belching, add chen xiang, xuan fu hua

# Accumulation heat in the liver and stomach

- Acute, burning pain in the epigastrium, irritability, acid regurgitation, dry bitter taste in the mouth. Red tongue yellow coating. Wiry rapid pulse.
- Treatment method: soothe the liver, clear heat, harmonize the stomach, relieve pain
- Formula: hua gan jian, zuo jin wan
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, ST36 zu san li, PC6 nei guan, LV2 xing jian, ST34 liang qiu, ST44 nei ting

- Hua gan jian:
  - Mu dan pi, shan zhi zi, bai shao yao, qing pi, chen pi, ze xie, chuan bei mu
- Zuo jin wan
  - Huang lian, wu zhu yu
- Modifications:
  - To resolve depression and relieve pain without yin depleting, add fo shou, mei gui hua, yu jin

# Obstruction of the stomach by static blood

- Stabbing stomach pain of fixed location which increases with pressure, vomiting blood or black stools. Dark purple tongue, rough, thready pulse.
- Treatment method: quicken the blood, abduct stagnation, rectify qi, relieve pain
- Formula: shi xiao san, dan shen yin
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, ST36 zu san li, PC6 nei guan, SP4 gong sun, ST34 liang qiu, ST21 liang men

- Shi xiao san:
  - Wu ling zhi, pu huang
- Dan shen yin:
  - Dan shen, tan xiang, sha ren
- Modifications:
  - For vomiting blood or bloody stools, add san qi, bai ji, di yu
  - For vacuity-cold of the spleen and stomach with failure of the spleen to secure the blood, use huang tu tang
  - In case of vacuous yin with blood heat, add bei sha shen, sheng di huang, mu dan pi, e jiao, mai men dong
  - For chronic bleeding due to qi and blood deficiency, use gui pi tang

# Depletion of stomach yin

- Dull indistinct epigastric pain, dry mouth, hard dry stool. Red dry tongue, rapid thready pulse.
- Treatment method: nourish yin, boost the stomach, relieve pain
- Formula: yi guan jian, shao yao gan cao tang
- Acupuncture: UB20 pi shu, UB21 wei shu, Ren12 zhong wan, ST36 zu san li, SP6 san yin jiao, Kl3 tai xi

- Yi guan jian:
  - Bei sha shen, mai men dong, dang gui, sheng di huang, gou qi zi, chuan lian zi,
- Shao yao gan cao tang:
  - Bai shao yao, zhi gan cao
- Modifications:
  - For burning epigastric pain, clamoring stomach and acid regurgitation, use zuo jin wan
  - For reduced food intake, delete mai men dong, add shan yao, bai zhu
  - For vacuous yin and blood, add he shou wu, bai zi ren, huo ma ren

# Vacuity cold of the spleen and stomach

- Dull indistinct epigastric pain, decrease in pressure or warmth, regurgitation of clear fluids, reduced food intake, fatigue, cold extremities, loose stool. Pale tongue white coating, slow and weak pulse.
- Treatment method: warm and supplement the spleen and stomach, relieve pain
- Formula: huang qi jian zhong tang
- Acupuncture: UB20 pi shu, UB21 wei shu, Ren12 zhong wan, ST36 zu san li, Ren6 qi hai, PC6 nei guan, SP4 gong sun

- Huang qi jian zhong tang:
  - Huang qi, bai shao yao, gui zhi, zhi gan cao, sheng jiang, da zao, yi tang

#### Modifications:

- For regurgitation of relatively large amount of clear fluids, add gan jiang, chen pi, ban xia, fu ling
- For poor food intake, eructation of foul gas and thick slimy tongue coating, add zhi shi, hou po, shen qu, mai ya
- For vacuity-cold of the spleen and stomach with failure of the spleen to secure the blood, use huang tu tang
- For cold is severe with acute pain and cold extremities, use da jian zhong tang
- For loose stools, use fu zi li zhong wan
- After alleviating of stomach pain, use xiang sha liu jun zi tang

# Hiccough e ni

- Hiccough is characterized by the counterflow of qi, resulting in the production of short spasmodic involuntary hiccup sounds
- It may occur as an isolated dysfunction, it may also occur during the course of the other acute and chronic disorders

# Etiology and pathogenesis

- Stomach qi couterflow
- Overeating: cold and raw foods; hot spicy foods
- Emotional depression or anger
- Chronic diseases

## **Patterns**

- Stomach cold
- Effulgent stomach fire
- Liver qi stagnation
- Spleen and stomach yang vacuity
- Stomach yin vacuity

## Stomach cold

- Deep slow and forceful hiccough, which is aggravated by cold and alleviated by warmth, no thirst, white coating and slow forceful pulse.
- Treatment method: warm the stomach, dispel cold, relieve hiccough
- Formula: Ding xiang shi di tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, Ll4 he gu, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB17 ge shu

- Ding xiang shi di tang
  - Ding xiang, gao liang jiang, shi di, zhi gan cao
- Modifications:
  - For severe cold, add wu zhu yu, rou gui
  - For phlegm and food stagnation, add hou po, chen pi, ban xia, fu ling

# Effulgent stomach fire

- Loud clear hiccough, halitosis, irritability, thirst with preference for cold drinks, dark scanty urine, constipation. Yellow coating, rapid slippery pulse.
- Treatment method: drain heat, downbear stomach qi, relieve hiccough
- Formula: Zhu ye shi gao tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, ST44 nei ting, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB17 ge shu

- Zhu ye shi gao tang
  - Zhu ye, mai men dong, shi gao, ren shen, fa ban xia, gan cao, jing mi
- Modifications:
  - To avoid fostering heat, delete ren shen, bei sha shen
  - To clear stomach and move qi downward, add shi di, zhu ru
  - For constipation with fullness of the abdomen, add xiao cheng qi tang

# Liver qi stagnation

- Hiccough associated with stress, distention and pain at the hypochondrium, boborygmus, flatulence. thin coating, wiry pulse.
- Treatment method: soothe the liver, calm the stomach, relieve hiccough
- Formula: Wu mo yin zi
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB17 ge shu, Ren17 tan zhong, LV3 tai chong, LV14 qi men

- Wu mo yin zi
  - Mu xiang, bing lang, zhi shi, wu yao, chen xiang
- Modifications:
  - To reinforce to soothe the liver and relieve stagnation, add chuan lian zi, yan hu suo
  - To move qi downward and relieve hiccough, add ding xiang, dai zhe shi
  - For liver fire, add huang lian, zhi shi, da huang
  - For phlegm, use xuan fu dai zhe tang

# Spleen and stomach yang vacuity

- Low weak hiccough that interferes with respiration,
  pale complexion, cold limbs, fatigue, low food intake,
  pale tongue white coating, deep thready weak pulse.
- Treatment method: warm and supplement the spleen and stomach, harmonize the middle burner, downbear qi, relieve hiccough
- Formula: li zhong tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB17 ge shu, Ren6 qi hai

- Li zhong tang
  - Ren shen, bai zhu, gan jiang, gan cao
- Modifications:
  - To reinforce to warm the middle burner and relieve hiccough, add dao dou, wu zhu yu, di xiang
  - For kidney yang deficiency, add rou gui, fu zi
  - For food stagnation, add chen pi, mai ya
  - For spleen qi deficiency, use bu zhong yi qi tang

# Stomach yin vacuity

- Fast and abrupt hiccough, irritability, dry mough, dry red tongue with cracks, rapid thready pulse.
- Treatment method: nourish stomach yin, generate liquid, relieve hiccough
- Formula: yi wei tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB17 ge shu, Kl3 tai xi, SP6 san yin jiao

- Yi wei tang
  - Bei sha shen, sheng di huang, mai men dong, yu zhu, bing tang
- Modifications:
  - To reinforce to relieve hiccough, add pi pa ye, shi hu, shi di
  - To boost qi and harmonize the middle jiao,
    add ju pi zhu ru tang

# Vomiting ou tu

 Ou referring to the condition in which there is vomit with sound, tu referring to the condition in which there is vomit without sound.

#### Includes:

 Acute and chronic gastritis, gastrectasis (dilation of the stomach), cardiospasm and esophageal spasm.

# Etiology and pathogenesis

- Six external evils
- Internal disruption
  - Seven affects
  - Improper diet
  - Eating habits

## **Patterns**

- Exterior evil invading stomach
- Food stagnation
- Liver qi invading stomach
- Obstruction of phlegm dampness
- Depletion of stomach yin
- Vacuity cold of spleen and stomach

# Exterior evil invading stomach

- Sudden onset of vomiting accompanied by aversion to cold, fever, Body aches, oppression in the chest, epigastric fullness. White slimy coating, floating wiry pulse.
- Treatment method: dispel evils, transform turbidity with aromatic herbs, relieve vomiting
- Formula: huo xiang zheng qi san
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, Ll4 he gu, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB11 da zhu, GB20 feng chi

### Huo xiang zheng qi san

 Huo xiang, zi su ye, bai zhi, da fu pi, fu ling, bai zhu, chen pi, jiang ban xia, hou po, jie geng, zhi gan cao, sheng jiang, da zao

#### Modifications:

- For food stagnation, delete bai zhu, zhi gan cao, da zao, add shen qu, ji nei jin
- For strong wind-cold evil, add fang feng, jing jie
- In case of attack by summerheat-dampness, delete bai zhi, bai zhu, zhi gan cao, da zao, add huang lian, pei lan, he ye

# Food stagnation

- Vomiting of undigested food, eructation of foul gas, acid regurgitation, epigastric distention. Loss of appetite, foul stools. Thick slimy coating, slippery pulse.
- Treatment method: disperse food, abduct stagnation, relieve vomiting
- Formula: bao he wan
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, Ren11 jian li, Ren 21 xuan ji, SP14 fu jie

#### Bao he wan:

 Shan zha, shen qu, jiang ban xia, fu ling, chen pi, lian qiao, lai fu zi

#### Modifications:

 For constipation with fullness of the abdomen, add xiao cheng qi tang

# Liver qi invading the stomach

- Vomiting, belching, acid regurgitation, which are associated with stress. Oppression in the chest, hypochondria pain. White thin coating, wiry pulse.
- Treatment method: soothe the liver, calm the stomach, downbear qi, relieve vomiting
- Formula: ban xia hou po tang with zuo jin wan
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, LV3 tai chong, GB34 yang ling quan

- Ban xia hou po tang
  - Jiang ban xia, hou po, fu ling, sheng jiang, zi su ye
- Zuo jin wan
  - Huang lian, wu zhu yu
- Modifications:
  - For heat in the stomach and intestine, add da huang,
    zhi shi
  - For severe heat in the liver and stomach, add zhi zi,
    zhu ru

# Obstruction of phlegm dampness

- Vomiting of clear liquid and mucus, epigastric fullness, loss of appetite, dizziness, palpitation. White slimy coating. Slippery pulse.
- Treatment method: warm and dispel phlegm, calm the stomach, relieve vomiting
- Formula: xiao ban xia tang with ling gui zhu gan tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, SP9 yin ling quan, SP4 gong sun, ST40 feng long

- Xiao ban xia tang
  - Ban xia, sheng jiang
- Ling gui zhu gan tang
  - Fu ling, gui zhi, bai zhu, zhi gan cao
- Modifications:
  - For phlegm heat, use wen dan tang, zhi ban xia, zhu ru, chen pi, zhi shi, zhi gan cao, fu ling, sheng jiang, da zao

# Depletion of stomach yin

- Repeated vomiting with spells of retching, thirst, dry mouth, hunger without desire for food, red with little coating, rapid thready pulse.
- Treatment method: nourish stomach yin, downbear qi, relieve vomiting
- Formula: mai men dong tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, SP4 gong sun, Kl3 tai xi, SP6 san yin jiao

- Mai men dong tang
  - Mai men dong, ren shen, jiang ban xia, gan cao, jing mi, da zao
- Modifications:
  - Ren shen is often replaced by bei sha shen
  - For severe fluid depletion, reduce jiang ban xia, add shi hu, tian hua fen, zhi mu, zhu ru
  - For constipaiton, add huo ma ren, feng mi

# Spleen and stomach vacuity cold

- Vomiting due to increase in food intake, pale complexion, fatigue, cold extremities, loose stool.
   Pale tongue white coating, weak pulse.
- Treatment method: warm the middle burner, strengthen the spleen, calm the stomach, downbear qi
- Formula: li zhong tang
- Acupuncture: Ren12 zhong wan, PC6 nei guan, ST36 zu san li, UB20 pi shu, UB21 wei shu, SP4 gong sun

- Li zhong tang
  - Ren shen, bai zhu, gan jiang, gan cao
- Modifications:
  - To reinforce the effect against vomiting, add jiang ban xia, chen pi, sha ren
  - For prolonged vomiting of clear fluid, add wu zhu yu
